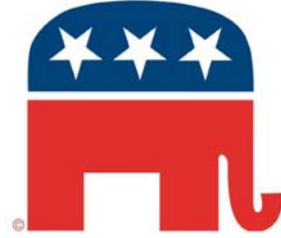

Rules of Convention

1. The stage area of the auditorium is limited to use by the County Executive.
2. Only duly certified delegates are permitted to vote or to move, second, or debate motions. Prior to speaking, a delegate must first be recognized by the Chair and will state his or her name and voting precinct. No one may speak twice on any motion. In any debate, no more than three persons each may speak in support of, or in opposition to, any motion.
3. Convention business will follow the printed agenda.
4. All convention matters which are not expressly covered by these rules, by the By-Laws or by Utah state statute are governed by Roberts' Rules of Order.
5. Proposed amendments to the Rules must be filed in writing with the Convention Chair prior to the adoption of the Rules. Once adopted, the Rules may be suspended only by a two-thirds vote of the Delegates.

**A Resolution Affirming the Sovereignty of the State of Utah
in all Powers not Delegated to the United States Government
by the Constitution of the United States of America**

WHEREAS, the states of these United States of America grant to the United States Government, an agent of the states, the full scope of its legal powers through the Constitution of the United States of America; and

WHEREAS, the State of Utah was accepted as a member of the United States of America on January 4th, 1896, and has since that time been protected and bound by the U.S. Constitution; and

WHEREAS, the Tenth Amendment to the U.S. Constitution states, “The powers not delegated to the United States by the Constitution, nor prohibited by it to the States, are reserved to the States respectively, or to the people.”; and

WHEREAS, it is unlawful for the U.S. Government to compel the states, collectively or individually, through threats of civil or criminal penalties or sanction or the withholding of federal funding, to comply with compulsory federal regulations outside the scope of those affairs not explicitly granted to the U.S. Government by the U.S. Constitution; and

WHEREAS, many federal laws are in direct violation of the Tenth Amendment of the U.S. Constitution; and

WHEREAS, The Constitution of the State of Utah, Section 27, declares, “Frequent recurrence to fundamental principles is essential to the security of individual rights and the perpetuity of free government.”; be it

RESOLVED, that the Cache County Republican Party declares the fundamental principles of the U.S. Constitution are and ought to be fully in force as they have been since their ratification by the states; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Cache County Republican Party claims for the State of Utah sovereignty under the Tenth Amendment to the U.S. Constitution over all powers not otherwise enumerated and granted to the U.S. Government by the U.S. Constitution; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Cache County Republican Party will act to facilitate the United States’ recurrence to those fundamental principles essential to the security of individual rights and the perpetuity of free government; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Cache County Republican Party shall declare to the United States and Utah State legislatures that the U.S. Government is in violation of U.S. Constitutional Law and requires the legislature remand the U.S. Government and restore the powers of the people, the states, and the federal government to their constitutional authorities by prohibiting all pending and future legislation and repealing all existent legislation which is in violation of the U.S. Constitution; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Cache County Republican Party requests assistance from all political parties and persons affiliated or unaffiliated in Cache County in the passage of legislation which restores to the states and people those powers unlawfully assumed by the U.S. Government; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the elected secretary of the Cache County Republican Party shall deliver, within 30 days of passage, this resolution to the legislators of the State of Utah and the United States Government who represent the people of Cache County, Utah, United States of America.
