 - **Dianna Schaeffer: 9 votes (5.3%)**

Voting for each office at any Central Committee meeting or county convention shall be among only the voting precincts governed or represented by that office. The winner will be determined by a majority of votes cast. Multiple rounds will be held if necessary until a majority winner is determined. In the event there are multiple rounds needed, the lowest vote getter in each round will be dropped from the next round until a winner is declared by majority.
