Here are the proposed rules for the County Executive Special Election.

- Candidates are welcome to campaign in their designated areas. A table will be provided, you are required to clean up after yourselves. All campaigning must stop when the meeting is called to order, this includes electronic campaigning in the form of automated texts, emails, handing out literature, buttons, etc.
- Each candidate will have 5 minutes to give their speech. Speaking order is determined by the [2020 – 2021 MASTER BALLOT POSITION LIST](#) as determined by the Utah Lieutenant Governor's office on March 27, 2020.
- Per the [County Party Bylaw 9A](#), The first candidate receiving a "majority vote of those present and authorized to vote" is the winner.
- Electronic voting or paper balloting may be used. Illegal or blank ballots will not be counted in the total.
- It may be necessary to have multiple rounds of voting to determine the winner by a majority of ballots cast. Poll watchers cannot be candidates.

This section is for reference only:

ARTICLE 9. VOTING

(9A) All matters to be voted upon by any committee established by these By-laws or any convention or precinct caucus shall be by majority vote of those present and authorized to vote, unless otherwise specified herein. An election vote among multiple candidates to fill more than one position that does not produce enough majority vote winners to fill the positions shall be completed either by additional rounds of voting among the remaining candidates or by ratifying the plurality vote winners by a majority vote. Voting for each office at any Central Committee meeting or county convention shall be among only the voting precincts governed or represented by that office. Voting by proxy is expressly prohibited at any meeting of any committee established herein or any convention or precinct caucus.
